Thank you for arranging contractor feedback.

It is noted that the compound is being opened at 7.30am which in itself will create a disturbance. 8am was stated on the previous planning conditions so there should not be any movement until this time. It would appear from the report that tenants are being disturbed before operational hours, triggering a referral at political level.

The planning application remains awaiting a decision despite the significant time elapsed since submission. There is no guarantee that permission will be granted and a direct report of disturbance to the planning office certainly won't help. The reported disturbances may become detrimental to the planning outcome. It is therefore in the best interest for the contractor to limit disturbances.

It needs to be reiterated that the provision of the upper compound is a goodwill gesture by the Council and was not part of the tender which only allowed for the bottom compound area. If tenant complaints become prevalent, the Council will also need to review usage.

Pleased to hear that Tooms have conducted a toolbox talk with its operatives.

Good afternoon All,

We have reviewed vehicle and staff movements from last Monday, including tracker information and speaking with the operatives – no member of staff was on site prior to 7.30 on the Monday in question.

The compound was opened around 7.30am as is normal, this involves unlocking the fencing and opening them up, before that operative then proceeds to the lower compound by car to undertake same. The only piece of plant to undertake works in and around either Compound is the Handler – which is kept overnight in the lower compound so would not have been anywhere near the upper compound until around 8am at the earliest – the only ‘digger’ on site at the time was at Willaston Crescent.

The site was closed at 4pm on the Bank Holiday Monday to allow operatives some additional time to make it through the access road, again the timing and accusations below do not align with what we know to be the facts.

As [redacted] has suggested, the new planning application should have included changes to the operational times which were discussed, and amendments agreed some 12 months ago. This included an amendment to the Bank Holidays and TT period as they did not align with our, or the wider construction industries Holidays and shutdowns – most Contractors were working on Monday, including on the New Apartment block at Willaston. I’d have thought this application would have been well through the system by now and If this is not the case, this is not something we are aware of until now.

We have held a further toolbox talk with the operatives involved in works within the upper compound and re-affirmed no disruptive activity can take place in there until 8am and to ensure the road leading to it is kept clear and free from debris. We would also note that generally no works are undertaken on a Saturday and the site, and therefore compounds; remain closed.

Further to the below, it would appear this has now been escalated to the Planning Department and MHK level.

Communication received today suggests that *'the compound was opened at 7am yesterday (bank holiday) and the digger was there moving things around for half an hour from 7.30 which was extremely noisy. I do have a recording of the noise and it is totally unacceptable at this time. They were then back and forth most of the morning at least 12 times and then closed the site around 5pm'*.

If this is allegedly factual, the compound is not being used in line with planning conditions. If this is allegedly factual, there is now a very real chance that this completely jeopardises the current planning application which would result in closure of the compound to the detriment of the contractor's own failings. There are no other alternative sites at short notice.

I attach a previous planning approval notice indicating the conditions of usage for reference.

Can you please relay the seriousness of the situation to the contractor immediately and I look forward to your feedback in this respect.

We have received the below communication from a resident. Can you please review how the STORAGE compound is actually being utilised. Anything more than its use as a storage facility and consisting of more items of storage than included on the planning application would be in contravention of its intended usage. Road cleaning is also an issue at both compounds and the lack of a banksman has been highlighted previously. If this compound is not being used as it is intended, there is a very high risk that it will become unavailable at short notice. This may also jeopardise the awaited planning approval.

'Good afternoon

I am emailing with my concerns over the above so called 'Temporary storage depot'.

This is causing the residents of the street much upset, the constant noise from the digger beeping filling metal skips with a metal tray banging to empty the contents of the tray. I have literally been home for one hour and the digger has already been back and forth 6 times. There is also rubble all over the road which is causing damage to the cars when the stones are flicked up by passing vehicles causing dirt and dust along the street. For the neighbours with breathing issues this dust is particularly bad.

They are working to no strict rules at present as nothing has been agreed and have been for at least the past 10 months, they are there from around 7.30 am until at least 5pm. Bank holidays we thought we would get a reprieve and some much needed peace but no they work all day.

This depot is more of a waste dump (3 big skips for rubble, glass and wood) not a storage depot and I think we have put up with this longer than we should have had to. The skip wagon was here to remove one of the skips at 7.30 in the morning and this is surely totally unacceptable in a residential area.

The houses on this road have been renovated and the houses and cars are filthy due to all the rubble dust from this site.

Good morning , et al, I hope you are all well

I also had reason to visit the site yesterday afternoon, to meet with the constituent who raised the concerns at our Political Surgery on Saturday 21/09/2024, and, unfortunately , my photos tell a different story to the one you have attached. Residents in the area advised me that there was a man with a broom sweeping outside the gates of the site down to the start of the reserved parking space yesterday morning, probably immediately prior to your photo. And there are other concerns regarding the 'storage' site.

During my time with the constituent, the big digger type machine visited the site 3 times, the noise of the digger emptying the rubble from the refurbishment site is immense, and this is happening 33-4 times per hour, every hour, during the working day. I appreciate it is a building project and some noise and heavy machinery is to be expected, but the residents in the area have been subjected to this for years now, which is not acceptable to them as their area has now been refurbished/updated, so there does not appear a good enough reason for them to continue to be subjected to the incessant noise and disturbance.

The 'storage' site, while does store some goods, appears to be more of a dumping site, with all the waste from the building site being deposited in the huge skips which are situated within the boundary of the site. This also has the knock on effect of the debris falling onto the roadway and the dust being deposited on the neighbouring properties and vehicles.

I also have concerns that the notice of planning application is obscured from the eyes of the general public, and is displayed on white paper, so not immediately obvious to passers by, indeed I had to search for quite a while to find it. I was of the impression that planning notices were to be displayed on yellow paper so they were immediately obvious. If my impression is correct, I believe the company/council are in breach of planning for this temporary 'storage' area.

In respect of the adjoining land/gardens to the site, is permanently flooded, and is a breeding ground for vermin. His garden has been split in half (a few years ago) by the Council and with a Council assurance that they would attend to clear the debris left in the back half of his garden, which has still to be done - can this be actioned please? It's also timely to mention that the tenant of is a night shift worker, so the impact of this ongoing 'storage' site is truly detrimental to his wellbeing.

I (hopefully) have attached some of the photos and video that I took yesterday, but I am also equally happy to call into City Hall and share them with you.

I appreciate that the refurbishment of the properties in Willaston is an ongoing project and there will be noise and disturbance due the nature of the project, however, I believe there can be an appropriate alternative to the current situation for the residents in the area of this site, and would be happy to discuss this further.

The comment stated;

Living close to this site I object to this planning application as nothing has changed since 2016 when 5 years was requested and rejected due to the impact on the housing around it. Since 2016 this has been a TEMPORARY depot and it finally closed 2022 so 6 years later. It is now being used again and requesting a further 2 years which I think is totally unacceptable and highly doubt if planning is given it will only be 2 years as Willaston estate is far from finished. Planning department granted the last application in 2020 so they could finish the northern part of the estate which is now complete. The noise, dust and heavy vehicles coming up and down from this depot is not acceptable. It is on a bus route with cars parked on both sides so not ideal for turning big diggers in the road when loading/unloading etc. Please see the reasons below on previous applications and do not permit this application. There is already another depot on Barrule Road that can be used, it is not the residents fault that two building sites are running at the same time.

16/01108/B - The applicant has requested a five year approval. This is considered to be too long a period, given the somewhat balanced foregoing assessment, and the impact of the proposal should be reassessed before then. It is accordingly concluded that a condition limiting the approval to 24 months, which would match the period as set out in the Temporary PDO, would be appropriate. That period should commence from roughly the time that the yard was opened. No exact date is known, but it is believed to be mid-June.

18/00682/B The use hereby approved shall cease by 1st September 2020, and the site cleared of any storage materials by that date.

21/00686/B The use hereby approved shall cease by 1st April 2022 or the completion of the renovation project, whichever comes first, and the site cleared of any stored materials.

In 2016 they requested a 5 year period which was declined due to the impact on the surrounding residents and here we are 2024 and they are still using it. What has changed since 2016 that it doesn't impact the residents.....absolutely nothing ! This estate is not likely to be finished anytime in the next 10 years so I if they are granted this they will request another 2 years in 2025 as they wont be finished. The houses on this road have been renovated and the houses and cars are filthy due to all the rubble dust from this site.

Can you all just come and take a look at what we are dealing with day after day?

My mother lives at [REDACTED]. I visit her daily and she has been suffering with the noise of the loud skip delivery???, one day we calculated over 20 wagons in and out dumping and making loud crashes. I have stayed with her a couple of days to see for myself and I was shocked at the level of disruption caused. You can also hear the workers in the yard swearing and shouting. It???s like living in a building site. This has cause tremendous stress if my almost 70 year old mothers mental health. Her car has also been hit by a digger and wing mirror damaged. It was a pleasure speaking with you recently and as requested by you I have put this in to an email.

Application No: 23/01226/B

I understand they are trying to get houses up to a better standard of living, but it is causing tremendous stress to myself and neighbouring houses.

There is no consistency of cleaning roads or spraying site to keep dust levels down. everywhere is covered in dust inside and outside of the home. Windows and doors. Vehicle covered inside and outside, having to wipe all windows and headlights before going anywhere is Soul destroying. I have a reserved park which many times has been covered in muck, that other cars have parked on it because they cannot see the sign on the road.

The noise of the wagons up and down can be 20 times a day and more dumping rubble and glass into big skips and then smashing it down. Is is absolutely unbearable, even with Windows shut you can still hear it. Along with the reverse beeping from site vehicles, this is more like an amenity site than a storage facility the fumes from the diesel engines which have been left to run for 20 minutes constantly lingering around the area you can really smell the fumes.

There is a river that runs from the top of Snaefell Road down to the bottom, and since the site has been used it has disrupted the land, my neighbours garden including mine have been completely flooded.

We have rats at the back which is concerning because poison has been put down and and we have seen many dead ones which are decomposing in the flood water meaning it's tainted with poison and disease, it's a serious health risk. You cannot sit in your own garden during the summer with the noise and constant dust flying in the air.

This is seriously affecting the well-being of myself and my fellow neighbours. we have also been told that the rubble and glass which is emptied on the site every day is classed as industrial waste.

I really hope you can help with what has been a traumatic 10 years dealing with this site in operation. I feel if his continues it will heavily impact further on our wellbeing.
