Question:

- 1. "Have Douglas Council been doing structural works without formal guidance or building control in place? This is particularly in regard to Spring Valley.**
- 2. What is the number of managing staff and housing officers in housing, and what is the number of amount of operational maintenance staff?**
- 3. Why are tenants being moved into Spring Valley still when the deterioration of property is visible, and a recurring problem?**
- 4. Which job role is responsible for compliance amongst these staff? Are DCC taking any action at all to resolve these issues?"**

Response:

1. No. A structural engineer has been involved in the works undertaken at Spring Valley. The works carried out are not notifiable under the relevant building control requirements.
